



# Business: EV Charging Rates Recommendation



- 1. EV charging station usage from Nov 2018 to Nov 2019 increased exponentially.
- 2. Highest month of EV charging station usage was Oct 2019
- 3. Notice the significant decline in EV charging in November 2019, the month the fee was initiated.

## Business: EV Charging Rates

Students:

Charge \$0.00/kWh for ChargePoint Charging Stations (no fee, students charge for free!)

Faculty/Staff/MPP:

Charge \$0.14/kWh for ChargePoint Charging Stations (cost of what Cal State East Bay pays per kWh for electricity)

Increase rate to \$0.28/kWh for EVs that charge over 4 hours

Non-Cal State East Bay Community Members:

Charge \$0.40/kWh for ChargePoint Charging Stations

Any other fees associated with EV charging stations to be covered by revenues received by the campus' parking facilities, to the extent not pledged in connection with bonds or notes issued pursuant to the State University Revenue Bond Act of 1947, as authorized in the Education Code.

### New Intel!

Interest in kWh and transaction cost (like an ATM fee) going to the user, not the campus

If kWh and transaction cost is covered by user, and not the campus, rates/kWh would increase to \$0.15 or \$0.16/kWh from the suggested \$0.14/kWh

## Ed Code 89701(3)

"All revenues received by the trustees from parking facilities, to the extent not pledged in connection with bonds or notes issued pursuant to the State University Revenue Bond Act of 1947, are hereby appropriated, without regard to fiscal years, to the trustees for the acquisition, construction, operation, and **maintenance** of motor vehicle parking facilities on real property acquired hereunder or on real property otherwise under the jurisdiction of the trustees, and for the study, development, enhancement, operation, and maintenance of alternate methods of transportation for officers, students, and employees of the California State University." Citation: Ed Code 89701(3)
